Neither accepting the risks of judged criminals being out of prisons to reduce the costs, help their rehabilitation and maybe even prevent them from getting worth if locked up. Nor accepting for all of us to be under surveillance to spot and prevent the crimes of a few individuals. We don't want criminals among us, we wouldn't feel safe relying on technology and worrying about cybersecurity. We don't want to live under permanent global surveillance, that would, by design, place all of us into preventive detention.
